Dear Ladies,

It is my delight and pleasure to invite you into my life, a rather very quiet one to a major extent, which thus far has only included my family, my work life, my immediate environment and my Inner Wheel Club. To think that now that I have a new horizon, is making me get all excited and at the same time a little worried. People associated with me by profession may know me as a strict lecturer who does not mince her words and refer to me as a subject matter expert. In Inner Wheel, many members outside my own club, Inner Wheel Club of Apsaras, and the District Executive Committee, might only know me by name. So, now that I am the District Chairman (DC) for District 330, it is only right on my part to invite you into my domain and introduce myself to you.

I, Kamala Nayagam Arumugam, (Kamala A. Yeap) was born on November 18, in Batu Gajah, Perak, but grew up in Ipoh. Ours was a joint-family setting, where my dad lived with his elder sister and her family, his younger brother and his family, as well as his nephew and family. So, ours was a home filled with noise, laughter, and everything else in a large homestead. This joint-family setting has ingrained in me the great value of family, so uncles, aunts, cousins, and siblings are an integral part of my life. As we grew up and as the extended family left for greener pastures, my immediate family stayed on in Ipoh until my siblings and I sprouted our wings and took to the sky. My late dad, Mr. N. Arumugam was well-known in Ipoh especially for his charitable work with the two main temples in Ipoh till his death 16 years ago. My mum was known for her devotional teachings and spiritual practices until her death earlier this year.

As the eldest child, my parents' expectation was on me to be the role model, set examples and be the best in whatever I did, so that my six younger siblings could follow my path. This expectation of my parents is the key to many of the personal successes that I have achieved. My dad was of the mind that there was no greater wealth than education, and this he cultivated in all our minds. In later years, when I got married, my husband, HC Yeap, too was of the same mind, that there was nothing greater than education. This enhanced my interest and ability to study.

My first degree is in Biology from the University of Madras, which enabled me to start my career as a Biology-teacher. After a few years, I took my second degree in Human Resource Management from the Asia Pacific University, New Zealand. Then, on a scholarship from the University of Sydney, I went off to pursue Post Graduate Diploma in Business Administration. The scholarship was extended and this enabled me to complete my Masters in Business Management. With my husband's encouragement, I returned to Malaysia to pursue a Master's program in Educational Administration and Management at University Putra, Malaysia.

All these qualifications enhanced my growth and I progressed from high school teaching to university lecturing. This also opened new dimensions of being involved in the setting up of colleges. I was a pioneer in setting up the then International College Penang (now known as Inti International University, Penang). This exposure also opened new ventures in lecturing and setting up overseas branch campuses in Australia, Beijing (China), Jonkoping (Sweden), Hertfordshire / Coventry / Nottingham Trent (UK), Los Angeles (USA), and Saudi Arabia. These overseas assignments were not only mentally stimulating but gave me an insight into working in environments that were totally different from the ones that I was used to at home in Malaysia. In many cases, it was an eye-opener.

Today, my husband and I, who have been in the field of education in total for about 90 years, feel the blessings of students, parents and teachers who remember us for the encouragement, the gift of love and the wealth of knowledge that we have imparted to them. In our fold of success, we have professors, lawyers, doctors, ministers, CEOs, and many others who welcome us with open arms and keep us in their embrace. In fact, I am proud to say that one of my students is a close associate of mine in Inner Wheel.

I joined the Inner Wheel Club of Seremban in 2011 and have held various positions with them. In 2016, I joined then-DC Parimala Satheesan's Executive Committee as the District International Service Organizer. In 2017, I chartered the Inner Wheel Club of Apsaras with twenty-three members. It was a delight to form a club of our own. In late 2018, IWC Apsaras started to hitch on an idea to form an Inner Wheel Club in Butterworth and in early 2019 the idea materialized and the Inner Wheel

Club of Butterworth was born. In 2020, I joined then-DC Shanti Menon as her District Treasurer. In 2021, I was the District Secretary for then-DC Shamini Nair. In 2022, I was the District Vice Chairman and now in Inner Wheel Year 2023-2024, I am on the hot seat as the 43<sup>rd</sup> District Chairman of IW District 330.

I am an introvert when I am amongst not-so-familiar people but most of my friends find me to be full of ideas. I take responsibility very seriously as I believe being responsible is an important aspect of life. As such, I will take this huge responsibility that has been placed on me seriously and pledge to do all that it takes to make Inner Wheel District 330 **Shine a Light**, while supporting International Inner Wheel President Trish Douglas in her term's flagship initiatives which cover the themes of **Brighten lives for the future** and **Mental wellness brightens lives**. #### Greetings, friends.

District Chairman Kamala, congratulations and best wishes to your team of 2023-2024. I pray that under your leadership, this new team will be blessed with good health and wisdom.

Friends, I take this opportunity to thank members of Districts 330 and 331 for electing me to serve as Editor/Media Manager of International Inner Wheel in IWY2021-2022 together with IIW President Ebe Martines, VP Zenaida Farcon, Treasurer Sarita Lunani, Constitution Chairman Sissel Michelsen, and the Board Directors notably our own member, Datin Seetha Lakshmi.



**Serving in this post before me** were eleven others (counting from 1998-1999). Succeeding me is Prabha Raghunandan.

It was a good experience. My first

time working with almost a full house of

ladies, which is quite a contrast to my career life. I say "almost" because the IIW Administrator is Mr Alan Phillips, a man with a sense of humour, who is always patient and obliging.

**My role in a nutshell**, is to publish matters of IIW in magazines, website and social media. No one tells me exactly what to do apart from the official duties and responsibilities (shortened to D&R in IIW lingo). Not forgetting, my mission writeup in the nomination booklet, I had thoughts of what to do from the start of term. Those thoughts were put to the test when I was invited to attend a segment of the first IIW Executive Committee (EC) meeting. In anticipation (thank God!) I had prepared a presentation.

The meeting was over Zoom because international borders were still locked due to COVID-19. It was my first meeting with anyone in IIW. It was the first conversation with EC members. Of course,

I was excited with a bit of trepidation. I asked to screen share. It was a short presentation.



According to my D&R, I need EC approval. Each of them made comments. They were all pleasant and supportive. Their verdict: I could go ahead! Throughout the year, there were several other meetings. All were

on Zoom. Unfortunately, with COVID-19, I didn't have the chance to travel.

Travel was unnecessary. I am born into this new era where telecommunicating with members worldwide is the new frontier. There was a **communication protocol** to adhere to. I had to message (bcc by email, of course) to NRs and not DCs unless the country has no NRs. There are clubs not administered by districts (NDCs) and to these, I would message to Vice-President who in turn would forward to the respective Board Directors assigned to the NDCs. The VP would also inform the IIW UN representatives. However,

> many emails were sent to me directly from Clubs or districts or national officers, which was the interesting part. Inner Wheel members worldwide practice a culture of decorum, politeness, and gentleness. Often, I would receive kind, inspiring and encouraging words. **Just have**

to remember that English may not be the first language of everyone but love is universal.





The rest of my IW term sped past quickly. Work wasn't much different from my publishing business. What I needed to keep in mind in editorial work was to ensure the right terminologies, salutation and branding of IIW and IW. (Do I hear gasps from past District Editors, "Oh! That's what I did, too!")

The Editor/Media Manager is not required to have technical knowhow of website development. IIW appointed a company to take care of it. At that time, the IIW website was already a decade old and getting heavy laden. There was also the legal aspect of UK's GDPR (data privacy). I was on home ground and so, I offered what I could in reviewing the website and had discussions with the EC members on various options. By the end of my term, the IIW website was revamped with a new simplified

concept, look and functions, and embedded with the power of social media platform. Google Workspace was adopted; its modern system of cloud-based storage for all members to access, productivity and collaboration tools were installed, with its flexible robust online security.

The Board Directors and later, the NRs were invited for the presentation and Q&A before being launched to the members worldwide in a new IW year. The truth was, the real work had just begun because members would have to learn to adapt and to embrace change. **Embracing change** is not about whether we are old or young but whether we are willing to learn. This is about technology and communication. It changes fast. The longer we delay, the more steps we have to catch up until it is too late because it is too much and too costly to catch up! Therefore, if we don't embark on the new now, then when? I salute the ECs for their cohesive courage and

decisiveness. It was gratifying to have worked alongside them.

Although my tenure is now completed, relationships formed did not end. I have friends now in all parts of the world. The experience has enriched me with knowledge and understanding of other cultures, traditions, and languages. What a marvellous world we live in.

Of all the posts in IIW, so long as we are not a National Governing

Body, District 330 can only nominate members to the posts of Editor/Media Manager or Board Director. It is easy to qualify for nomination to be Editor/Media Manager. I encourage our past District Editors to submit their nomination. Our District may not be large in numbers but we have quality!

To all members, our role is to **prioritise on increasing membership**. Whoever you meet, speak for Inner Wheel. More members mean more hands for good works. A large membership gives us the might to be impactful in uplifting communities.

In closing, my best wishes and may God bring fulfillment to the 2023-2024 team of District 330. As we **Shine A Light**, let's also promote PEACE and JOY in what we THINK, what we SAY, and what we DO.
